**Important Notes:**

1. This chart is not an exhaustive list of all the reasons for Additional Precautions and does not address Routine Practices (e.g., N95 mask for aerosol generating medical procedures).
2. The PPE listed is a minimum; additional PPE may be required based on a point of care risk assessment (e.g. N95 mask for COVID-19 if risk of aerosol generation, eye protection for MRSA if risk of body fluid exposure, gown/gloves for chickenpox if risk of direct contact, etc.).
